Air Rifle and Air Pistol Marksmanship Competition

The Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) invites you and your club rifle team to participate in the CMP's Monthly Matches. The matches will take place on the above dates at the CMP's brand new Competition Center North. The competition will feature a Junior Air Rifle 3x20, 60 Shots Air Rifle Standing, 60 Shots Air Pistol, a Novice Prone stage and the newly created National Match Air Rifle events.

CMP Competition Center North.

The new Competition Center is a major part of a "Joint Use Training Facility" that the Ohio National Guard and CMP constructed jointly. It is located on the east side of Camp Perry's Petrarca Range. The Center has a common area with classrooms, offices, restrooms and a foyer.



The south side houses expanded engagement skills training facilities to be used by the Ohio National Guard to train military personnel. The larger north end of the facility is a 20,000 sq. foot state-of-the-art air gun range. The Competition Center has 80 firing points, each equipped with MEGALink electronic targets. All shots are instantly displayed on monitors beside each shooter and on display screens visible to spectators in the center area of the range. All firing is controlled by a computer operations center in the middle of the range.

NATIONAL MATCH AIR RIFLE

This is a new course of fire developed by the CMP to provide an affordable, accessible form of air rifle competition that can be practiced by recreational target shooters as well as serious competitive highpower, smallbore or air rifle shooters who seek the benefits of off-season practice and competition. Experimental work on the National Match Air Rifle events began last summer when the new Camp Perry Competition Center offered sporter and precision air rifle standing re-entry events that were contested by several hundred competitors during the 2008 National Matches Air Gun Events. The CMP Board of Directors recently approved the full implementation of this promising new air rifle game. The one-day program features courses of fire that will be familiar to National Match highpower rifle competitors. There will be a 20-shot standing event as well as 60-shot prone, sitting and standing event. Both events will be fired on highpower rifle targets reduced for firing at 10 meters. Shooters will have the option of firing either 1) sporter class air rifles (loaner air rifles will be available), 2) precision class air rifles or 3) competition air rifles built on AR-type platforms.

WHAT.

3x20 - Juniors (as defined by rule 3.1 in the 2008-2010 National Standard Air Rifle Rules) are invited to participate in the 3 position air rifle (3x20) match. The match will conclude with a final for the top 8 competitors in both sporter and precision categories. Awards will be given out at the end of the match.

60 Shots Air Rifle Standing – The 60 shot standing match will be open to all ages. The match will conclude with a final for the top 8 shooters. Awards will be given out at the end of the match.

60 Shots Air Pistol – The 60 shot Air Pistol match will be open to all ages. The match will conclude with a final for the top 8 shooters. Awards will be given out at the end of the match.

National Match Air Rifle 20 Shots Standing – The 20 shot standing match will be open to all ages. There will be a 3 minute preparation followed by 2 sighting shots and 20 record shots in 22 minutes.

National Match Air Rifle 3x20 – The 3x20 match will be open to all ages.
Standing: 3 min. preparation, 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record standing, 22 minutes. AR-SR target.

Sitting/kneeling: 3 min. preparation, 2 sighting shots sitting (or kneeling), 2x10 shots for record, sitting (or kneeling) from standing. Shooters with pneumatic air rifles will be given 6 minutes for each set of 10 shots. Compressed air and CO2 rifle shooters will be given 4 minutes to fire each set of 10 shots. AR-SR target.

Prone: 3 min. preparation, 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record prone, 22 minutes, AR-MR target.

Novice Prone Match - This match is designed for beginning shooters between the ages of 8-12 years old and will be fired with Sporter class air rifles. The shooters

will fire sighting shots and 20 record shots in the supported prone position on the 200 yard reduced SR target. **An adult chaperone must be present with the shooter at all times to assist with loading and proper gun safety.** Loaner rifles will be available for individuals who do not have a rifle. There will be a 3 minute preparation period followed by 22 minutes to shoot a maximum of 10 sighting shots and 20 record shots. Loaner rifles will be available for anyone who does not have a sporter class air rifle.

RULES

Clear Barrel Indicator (CBI). CBIs will be required in the Marksmanship Center, in concert with CMP intent to promote the use of these devices. The CBI is a length of string trimmer line that is inserted through the bore, with ends protruding from the muzzle and the chamber. CBIs provide visual confirmation that the rifle/pistol is unloaded. CBIs must be inserted after rifles or pistols are uncased. CBIs will be available on the range for those that do not have them.

AWARDS.

The junior 3x20 event will be broken into Sporter and Precision categories. Both categories will receive 1st, 2nd and 3rd place individual awards as long as there is a minimum of five competitors in each category. If a category does not have the minimum of five shooters, we will award 1st place only.

For the 60 shot rifle and pistol matches, we will award 1st, 2nd and 3rd for Open and Junior categories. There is a minimum of five competitors required to award 2nd - 3rd in each category. If a category does not have the minimum of five shooters, we will award 1st place only.

For the National Match Air Rifle 3x20, we will award 1st, 2nd and 3rd place individual awards as long as there is a minimum of five competitors in each category. If a category does not have the minimum of five shooters, we will award 1st place only.

Competitors in the Novice prone competition will receive 1st, 2nd and 3rd place medals.

HOUSING. Competitors are responsible for their own housing. WHAT TO BRING. Shooters that use sporter class air rifles (Daisy M853/753/888/XSV40) should bring an air rifle for each shooter plus a sling, kneeling roll and glove. You will not need spotting scopes. Shooting mats will be provided at the range, but you may bring your own. Shooters that use precision air rifles should bring them plus their shooting jackets and other equipment. **Also bring your own pellets.** CO2 and compressed air will be provided.

DIRECTIONS TO RANGE. Camp Perry is located approximately five miles west of Port Clinton on Ohio state highway #2. The Camp Perry entrance is on the north side of hwy #2 and is marked by two lighthouses. Proceed north on the Camp Perry entrance road. From the Main Gate continue on the entrance road until you reach the stop sign at Sommers Rd. Go straight at the STOP sign to Lawrence Rd. Turn Right on Lawrence Rd. You will see a garage door covered range on your left. As soon as the covered range ends, turn left into the large

parking lot. The CMP Competition Center is a new build located next to the covered range. A map has been provided on the next page.

Competitors over the age of 18 must complete and sign our release form prior to arrival at Camp Perry. Shooters under the age of 18 must have a Junior Liability Release completed upon arriving at Camp Perry.
