**Organizer and Host.** The competition will be organized by the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) and hosted by the U.S. Army Marksmanship Unit at Fort Benning, Georgia.

**Competition Sanction.** CMP, representing the National Three-Position Air Rifle Council, has sanctioned this competition. Scores fired will be recognized as national records.

**EIC Credit Points.** The National Three-Position Air Rifle Council recognizes the championship as a “National Council Championship.” The top 50% of all competitors in the sporter individual events will receive credit points towards Junior Distinguished status in accordance with National Council regulations.

**Shipping Air Cylinders.** Teams that plan to, who do not wish to check air or CO<sub>2</sub> cylinders on their air flights may ship them in advance to: USAMU, Attn: International Rifle Team, 7031 Bills Street, Fort Benning GA 31905-5810. Air cylinder packages must have the name of the school or JROTC unit printed on the outside of the package. Please have a tracking number with you in case the package does not arrive prior to your arrival. When shipping boxes, please remember to purchase a return shipping label.

**Air and CO<sub>2</sub>.** Compressed air and CO<sub>2</sub> gas will be available at the range; all cylinder filling will be handled by AMU Staff.

**Check-In and Equipment Control.** At check-in, teams must confirm their final entries and purchase banquet tickets (\$20.00 each). There are no entry fees for this competition. All competitors must have their air rifles and shooting equipment checked at equipment control.

**Squadding.** A competition relay will be scheduled for each rifle class. Firing points will be assigned when entry confirmations are received by CMP. Teams (4 members only) will be squadded together. Teams are not permitted to shoot alternate shooters at this competition. Switching of firing points within teams after assigned will not be permitted. Squadding will be posted online the week prior to the competition.

**Clinics.** The U. S. Army Marksmanship Unit International Rifle Team will present a clinic on 28 March 2011 for all competitors and coaches. This clinic will include presentations on various shooting techniques.

**Electronic Targets.** The Pool Complex air gun range is equipped with electronic, single-bull targets that are used for all competition firing. Shooters do not need to bring spotting scopes. Competitors who have not previously fired on electronic targets will be briefed on electronic target operations prior to the start of their practice relay.

**Shooting Mats.** Shooting mats are not available at the range. Shooters must bring their own mats or make arrangements to have mats available.

**Shooting Tables.** Prone and kneeling positions are fired from tables at the Pool Complex. The target height is 1.4 meters (55 in.) and the table height is 28 ½ in. Firing in the prone or kneeling positions from the Fort Benning range tables at targets 55 in. high is equivalent to firing at prone and kneeling targets where the target center is 26.5 in. high for both positions (normal prone target center is 19.7 in., normal kneeling target center is 31.5 in.). Cadets who will compete at Fort Benning should practice firing from tables at targets whose centers are 55 in. above the floor, or from the floor at prone and kneeling targets whose centers are 26.5 in. above the floor. At Fort Benning, standing targets will be at the standard 55 in. height, but the prone position will require a position adjustment to raise the muzzle and line of sight and a kneeling position adjustment to lower the muzzle and line of sight.

**Individual Scoreboards.** Electronic scoreboards showing the value of each shot fired are located above each firing point. Coaches and spectators can follow the progress of the match

on these scoreboards. Limited seating will be available on the range for accompanying family members and friends who wish to watch the competition.

**Score Reporting.** Scores and competitor rankings will be displayed electronically on the range throughout the competition. Preliminary and final printed results bulletins will be posted on bulletin boards at the range. Scores fired will be entered in the CMP's Competition tracker results system shortly after firing.

**Fort Benning Waiver of Liability.** All competitors who fire on the USAMU ranges must sign a *Fort Benning Waiver of Liability*. A copy of this form is attached. Please make one copy for each team member. To complete for form, enter the competitor's name and then have the parent and a witness sign the form. The signed forms must be turned in at check in. Signed liability waivers must be provided to USAMU prior to any competitor being allowed to fire on their range.

**Closing Banquet.** The price for each banquet ticket is \$20.00 Competitors, coaches, and parents must purchase banquet tickets at check-in. The winning sporter four member team and head coach and winning precision four member team and head coach will be placed at the head table. Parents, school/club officials and other guests are welcome to attend any part of the competition and closing banquet.

**Dress for Banquet.** Participating teams, instructors and guests should plan to wear a coat and tie or dress at the closing banquet. All other competition events will be informal. The wearing of team uniforms or insignia on the ranges is encouraged.

## **USAIC Regulation 210-5, Chapter 5, Section I, Weapons**

### **5-2. Transporting weapons.**

- a. The carrying of weapons anywhere on the reservation, with the exceptions of subparagraph b below, is prohibited except by those who are engaged in law enforcement duties.
- b. All personnel assigned to or employed at (to include those personnel at Fort Benning in a TDY status) who desire to transport a privately owned weapon to and from hunting, sports shooting, or other recognized function involving that weapon will ensure that the weapon is unloaded. No weapon will be transported with a loaded magazine/clip affixed into the weapon. No weapon will be transported with a round in the chamber or any other projectile in a "ready to fire" configuration. Weapons will be transported in the trunk of vehicles, if so equipped. No weapon will be transported in glove compartments, under seats or any other concealed manner (except in the trunk of the vehicle).
- c. U.S. Government weapons will not be transported in privately owned vehicles.
- d. Personnel assigned to guard duties will be authorized to carry clubs while in the performance of their guard duties. These guards will, however, be thoroughly briefed on use of force per AR 190-14.
- e. Weapons of any kind are prohibited in all AAFES and DCA/MW R facilities.

### **5-3. Concealed weapons.**

No person shall carry a weapon concealed on his or her person at any time, with the exceptions of law enforcement personnel.

### **5-4. Firing or discharging weapons.**

- a. No weapon will be fired, discharged or used within the limits of the garrison/cantonment areas.
- b. No weapon will be fired, discharged or used within 50 feet of a training area building, ammunition storage area, active airfield, posted "no hunting" area, roadway or within 200 feet in the direction thereof.

### **5-6. Ammunition and Explosives.**

- a. The unusual amount and diversified character of firing conducted on Fort Benning requires that special and intelligent care be exercised to avoid accidents. All concerned with handling, care and use of ammunition and explosives, or with the conduct or direction of any firing, or the care and police of building and areas which are used for storing explosives will familiarize themselves with current safety regulations and field and technical manuals pertaining to the munitions being handled.
- b. The firing of ammunition of any type over buildings or other structures, public highways, or public railroads, is prohibited. Extreme care will be exercised and that areas of impact are at a safe distance from buildings or other structures, roads and railroads, and that such areas are fully within the limits of the reservation.
- c. The keeping of live ammunition, projectiles, or explosives as souvenirs by any person is prohibited.
