

**CMP JUNIOR RIFLE CAMPS  
WEEK 6  
FORT BENNING, GA  
STANDING POSITION CAMP**

**Location:** Pool Range, Fort Benning, GA  
**Dates:** 13-15 July 2009  
**Start Time:** 1000 Monday, 13 July, at range  
**Registration:** Registration will be held from 0900-0930 at the range. (This typically takes 10-15mins.)

**Camp Prerequisites:**

The Standing Position Camp is an advanced program designed to build on the curriculum taught at the CMP Three-Position Camps. Participants will have three days of intensive training in the standing position; this is not an appropriate program for beginning shooters. Athletes who wish to attend the Standing Position Camp are required to have attended at least one CMP Three-Position Camp prior to the start of the Standing Camp; admission of athletes who have not attended a Three-Position Camp will be at the digression of the Camp Director.

**Range Facilities:**

The Air Rifle Range is located at the Pool Shooting Complex at Fort Benning. Rifles and equipment will be secured at the range each night. The classroom will be located in the range. **A link for a map to the range is provided at the bottom of the main camp page.**

**Access to Fort Benning:**

Fort Benning is a U.S. Army Facility and all camp participants are subject to the rules and regulations of the base. Participants must check-in at the main gate on the first day of camp and receive a Fort Benning Visitor Pass for their vehicle. When registering vehicles a Fort Benning Weapons Disclosure Form must be submitted. All camp participants must also submit a Fort Benning Wavier of Liability Form at camp check-in at Pool Range. Both forms and a Fort Benning Map are provided with the adult leader's confirmation email. To reach the main gate, continue south on I-185 beyond exit 1, I-185 leads directly to Fort Benning's Main Gate.

**Camp Options:**

Participants are given the option to either attend camp as a resident or commuter camper. Residential campers are provided housing at Columbus State University, and breakfast and lunch at the range. Commuter campers are responsible for their own housing, and will only be provided lunch. Please indicate if you plan to attend camp as a resident or a commuter on your application form. Rates for the residential and commuter camps are listed in the **Costs** section of this program (below).

**Housing:**

Athletes and coaches attending camp as residents will be housed in the dorms at Columbus State University, 4225 University Avenue, Columbus, GA 31907. A map to the housing facilities will be provided at check-in. **Participants will check-in at the conclusion of the first day of camp on 13 July.** Please contact Sommer Wood prior to the start of camp if you have special rooming requests/needs. Participants need to bring their own bed linens, towels, toiletries, and hair dryers. Internet access is not provided in rooms, and there are no televisions in rooms. The dorms do have small kitchens, if campers wish to bring cooking supplies. **Camp staff will be housed at a different location and will not be responsible for the supervision of athletes in the residence halls; this will be the responsibility of their adult leader.** More information about Columbus State University can be found at [www.colstate.edu](http://www.colstate.edu).

**Food:**

Lunch and breakfast will be provided at the range. Snacks will also be provided by CMP during classroom breaks. **Participants are on their own for dinner.** The first meal for residential campers will be

lunch on 13 July, and the last meal will be breakfast on 15 July. The first meal for commuters will be lunch on 13 July, and the last will be lunch on 14 July.

**What to bring:**

Campers must bring their own shooting equipment including but not limited to rifles, shooting clothing, pellets and journals. Do not bring spotting scopes, as all shooting will be done on electronic targets where shot locations are shown on monitors at the firing line. CO<sub>2</sub> and compressed air will be provided at the range, though it is recommended that individuals bring their own fill adapters. Campers need to make sure that they are dressed comfortably in athletic clothing and footwear because light physical training is incorporated into the daily program. Residential campers need to bring bed linens, towels, toiletries, hair dyers and any other personal items that they need for their dorm rooms.

**Costs:**

Commuter Camp: Athletes: \$225, Adults: \$30  
Residential Camp: Athletes: \$350, Adults: \$150

**\$30 deposit and Medical Release forms are due with each participant's registration (Athlete and Adult Leader). Deadline for final payment is 24 April 2009, if payment is not received by the deadline the applicant will be dropped from camp.**

If you need to cancel your reservation you must do so in writing 2 weeks prior to the start of your selected camp for a partial refund.
